### **Recent Developments**

#### **Economic**

China has <u>announced</u> that it will increase military aid to Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan, pledging \$16 million to Kyrgyzstan alone.

The European Bank for Reconstruction and Development's September regional <u>assessment</u> has warned that the Russian economy will come to a 'standstill' in the next few months.

Tajikistan and China have <u>agreed</u> to construct the regional Line D gas pipeline through Tajikistan, which will earn Tajikistan millions of dollars in transit fees annually once operational.

Kazakhstan continues to face gasoline <u>shortages</u> as the devaluation of the Kazakh currency prevents importers from being able to afford to import refined oil from Russia, even though Kazakhstan itself is a major crude oil producer.

Vladimir <u>Putin</u> met with his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping on the side-lines of the SCO summit in September to discuss a gas pipeline connecting Siberia to China.

The Russian Foreign Minister, Sergei Lavrov, said that he hoped <u>Kyrgyzstan</u> will be able to quickly integrate into the Eurasian Economic Union.

Kazakhstan has legalised 'shadow capital' (money, security and shares obtained illegally) in an effort to pump more money into its ailing economy.

Kyrgyzstan is facing high <u>unemployment</u> amongst truck drivers following the US withdrawal from Manas air base in Kyrgyzstan.

The Kazakh President, Nursultan Nazarbaev, has <u>expressed</u> his concern about the impact that the Ukraine crisis is having on Kazakhstan's economy.

#### **Politics**

Afghanistan's Independent Election Commission (IEC) finally <u>announced</u> that Ashraf Ghani won the country's presidential runoff election, winning 55.27 percent of the votes.

The Caspian Sea Summit <u>commenced</u> in Russia in late September, with Vladimir Putin telling attendees that he hoped that the Summit would be able to finally resolve the legal status of the Caspian Sea.

The Canadian-Tajik Ph.D researcher, Alex Sodiqov, who was arrested while <u>undertaking</u> fieldwork in Tajikistan in June, has finally been allowed to return to Canada.

US Secretary of State, John Kerry, <u>met</u> with the Kazakh Foreign Minister, Erlan Idrisov, in Washington on September 22. Kerry emphasized the importance of US-Kazakh strategic partnership.

Turkmenistan plans on opening an <u>embassy</u> in Kyrgyzstan soon to expand its international ties.

Dozens of relatives of Kazakh <u>prisoners</u> protested in front of a prison in Pavlodar to demand visitation rights.

The Shanghai Cooperation Organization held a twoday summit in Tajikistan's capital, Dushanbe on 11-12 September.

Kyrgyz authorities <u>said</u> that they have detained a Tajik man who was planning on joining militants in the Palestinian Territories on September 11.

Uzbek authorities have finally confirmed that Gulnara Karimova, the daughter of President Islam Karimov, is under house arrest on suspicion of corruption.

Tajikistan's state-appointed Mufti issued a fatwa (religious ruling) declaring that criticising the government is a sin and must be condemned.

Iran and Tajikistan signed agreements on further cooperation on security and education during the Iranian president's visit to Dushanbe for the SCO summit.

Three organizers of the proposed-Kyrgyz <u>protest</u> against electricity price rises were arrested ahead of the September 16 demonstration.

#### Security

Russia's Defence Ministry has revealed that it will hold large-scale military manoeuvres close to the Kazakh border.

Two Russian soldiers have been <u>deported</u> from Tajikistan after being accused of murdering a taxi driver. The victim's family have cast doubt on whether the suspects will face justice in Tajikistan.

Turkmenistan's armed <u>forces</u> are thought to have crossed the border into Afghanistan in September to push back Taliban militants who were stationed near border.

Two ethnic Uzbeks in Tajikistan were <u>sentenced</u> to nine years in prison for fighting with Taliban in Afghanistan.

The Taliban killed an Australian-Afghan <u>citizen</u> in late September who had returned home after 14 years.

The Tajik President, Emomali Rahmon, said that 200 Tajik nationals have joined to Islamist militant groups in Iraq and Suria.

A Kyrgyz official reported that <u>eight</u> Kyrgyz nationals have been killed in Syria. Approximately 100 Kyrgyz citizens are thought to be fighting in Syria and Irag.

A bomb exploded near the Afghan Presidential compound the day before the new Afghan President's inauguration.

Josh Earnest, a White House spokesman, said that US expects that the new Afghan President, Ashraf Ghani, will sign a Bilateral Security Agreement soon after he takes office.

31 people were killed and dozens wounded in an attack by Taliban on a government compound in eastern Afghanistan.

A NATO-led convoy in Kabul was targeted by a Taliban suicide car bomb in mid-September, killing three members of the NATO-led force.

The black flag of the Middle Eastern 'Islamic State' (IS) group was hung from a Tashkent bridge on August 28, prompting Uzbek police to investigate.

Three Tajik nationals were sentenced almost to four years in prison by a Russian court on charges of being members of a terrorist group.
