2021 was a very busy year for the Middle East Studies Forum. We were Australia's go-to information hub for the presidential election in Iran and we saw exponential growth in our public engagement. We welcomed two new members, our members published extensively and we celebrated grants and awards.

Research Recognition

2021 in review

This year our members saw great success. Dr Dara Conduit won a Discovery Early Career Researcher Award (DECRA) from the Australian Research Council for her project on digital authoritarianism in Syria and Iran. MESF Convenor Professor Shahram Akbarzadeh, Professor Ihsan Yilmaz, Dr Zahid Ahmed & Dr Mahmoud Pargoo won a Gerda Henkel Foundation grant for their project on Smart Digital Technologies and the Future of Democracy in the Muslim World. Professor Akbarzadeh also won this year's Elie and Sylvia Kedourie Prize for an outstanding co-authored article in *Middle Eastern Studies* titled 'Religionisation of politics in Iran: Shi'i seminaries as the bastion of resistance.' We are proud of all our members' achievements.



MESF Events

We hosted eleven <u>webinars</u>, featuring local and international guest speakers. While all of our events attracted high participation a webinar presented by Dr Yasmin Chilmeran of the Swedish Institute of International Affairs particularly attracted interest. Building upon her post-doctoral research, Dr Chilmeran discussed 'Iraqi Women's Participation in Peacebuilding Across Local, National and Global Contexts'. The webinar, moderated by MESF's Dr Hadeel Abdelhameed, garnered much discussion. Recordings of each webinar are made available on our website.

A number of events were in collaboration with international partners. We partnered with Qatar University Gulf Studies to discuss <u>Iran's presidential election</u>. We partnered with Durham University in co-hosting an online panel discussion titled '<u>ICPoA</u> revival: implications for regional dynamics in the Persian Gulf'. This panel, moderated by MESF's Professor Shahram Akbarzadeh and Professor Anoush Ehteshami, featured speakers from King's College London, Cranfield University and Qatar University.

Many notable and important partnerships were formed in 2021. We partnered with DFAT Council for Australian-Arab Relations and WoMENA in hosting a panel of female experts who discussed the role of women in the <u>Middle East uprisings</u>.

Research Engagement

This year we launched 'Iran Election 2021' on our website. This was Australia's go-to information hub on the 13th Presidential Election of the Islamic Republic of Iran. We hosted webinars about the election and MESF's Dr James Barry moderated a <u>podcast</u> about the election that was published on our website and Twitter account. Professor Shahram Akbarzadeh discussed the election at a webinar hosted by the <u>Australian Institute of International Affairs</u> and Dr Mahmoud Pargoo discussed the election at events held by the Middle East Institute Singapore and Rudaw in Iraq.

The US decision to withdraw from Afghanistan and the fall of Kabul to the Taliban was a major event in 2021. MESF members brought their expertise to public debate on this topic. Professor Akbarzadeh and Dr Ibrahimi offered expert accounts to TRT World (Turkey), CNA (Singapore), Channel News Asia, SBS and ABC news about the political ramifications of the Taliban takeover. MESF public commentary were published on leading media outlets, such as Al Jazeera and <u>The Conversation</u>.

Our website gained a 45% increase in traffic this year and our <u>Twitter</u> <u>profile</u> saw an average of 2,551 views per month; a 145% increase compared to 2020. We gained 600 new followers since this time last year and <u>our top Tweet</u> was seen 37,000 times.

A Growing MESF Network

This year we welcomed two new members; <u>Dr Hadeel Abdelhameed</u> and <u>Associate Professor Ahmed S. Hashim</u>.

Dr Abdelhameed's research interests include Iraqi gender politics and feminism, Iraqi social movements, and Iraqi theatre and drama about war. She co-authored the forthcoming 'Palgrave Handbook of Gender and Communications' which will be available in 2022.

Associate Professor Ahmed S. Hashim is an expert on Iranian ways of war and global counter-terrorism measures. We will celebrate the launch of his forthcoming book 'Iranian Ways of War: From Cyrus the Great to Qasem Soleimani and Beyond' in 2022.
